

A Tranquil and Peaceful Sensory Garden: A local veteran's charity has recently completed the latest of its garden areas – an impressive Sensory Garden. Come and visit SHQ and enjoy the gardens – as well as a visit to this Grade II historic building. SHQ is open every Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Ghostly Airfields and Superstitions: Old airfields and ghost stories go hand-in-hand. The historic Grade II listed West Raynham Station Headquarters (SHQ)is hosting an evening of 'Ghostly airfield tales, superstitions, and gremlins. The evening is not a 'scare fest' and is intended as entertaining – and is based on real stories and incidents and in part helps remember those who served at RAF airfields. RECIPE OF THE MONTH: ENGLISH PLUM TART: Serves 8

A SIMPLE RECIPE NOW THAT ENGLISH PLUMS ARE ON SALE

1 TART PLATE AND 1 LARGE BOWL. OVEN: 180 FAN, 400, 200, GAS 6, AIR FRYER 180. 240 GRAMS PLAIN FLOUR; 300 GRAMS CHOPPED WALNUTS; 135 GRAMS SOFT BROWN SUGAR; 170 GRAMS BUTTER — COLD AND CUBED; 1 LARGE EGG YOLK; 8 PLUMS (VICTORIA IF POSSIBLE OR ANY OTHER ENGLISH PLUM) STONED AND HALVED.

PREHEAT OVEN. SPRAY THE TART PLATE WITH A LITTLE OIL. POUR FLOUR, NUTS AND SUGAR INTO YOUR BOWL AND COMBINE. ADD THE BUTTER AND EGG YOLK AND MIX TOGETHER UNTIL YOU HAVE CRUMBS. TAKE ¾ OF THE CRUMB MIXTURE AND LINE THE BOTTOM AND SIDES OF THE TART TIN PRESSING DOWN UNTIL NICE AND SMOOTH. ARRANGE THE PLUM HALVES IN A CIRCULAR PATTERN ON TOP OF THE CRUMB MIXTURE THEN SPRINKLE THE REMAINING CRUMBS ON TOP OF THE FRUIT COVERING THE PLUMS COMPLETELY. BAKE FOR 35 TO 40 MINUTES OR UNTIL THE CRUST IS NICELY BROWN — TRY 25 TO 30 MINS IN YOUR AIR FRYER BUT KEEP YOUR EYE ON IT DEPENDING ON THE POWER OF YOUR OVEN. LOVELY WITH ICE CREAM, CLOTTED CREAM OR CUSTARD.



UKRAINE – TIGHTROPE WALKING ITS WAY TO PEACE

Tightrope walking is the skill of maintaining balance whilst walking along a tensioned wire between two points – a skill that Ukraine's President Zelensky must master if he is to secure a lasting peace for his country – and it is most uncomfortable and fraught with difficulty. At the time of writing this letter President Zelensky is preparing to meet President Trump at the White House backed up by a significant number of European leaders, all hoping to persuade the American President that no peace deal can be secured without Ukraine's direct involvement and that any deal must be backed up by 'cast-iron' security guarantees. There is obviously a good rapport between Presidents Trump and Putin which leads many to fear that 'the master deal maker' might be overly swayed by the former KGB intelligence officer. The problem is that although the majority of commentators believe that militarily Ukraine is losing ground and must consider suing for peace, there are others who believe that it is actually Russia who is under the greatest strain with the danger of collapse – and a peace deal which cedes Ukrainian territory to Russia at this point might actually gift the Russian President a 'victory' that he might not have achieved otherwise. It's hard to tell and very hard for President Zelensky who on the one hand can't afford to upset his countrymen by giving away too much but on the other, can't afford to upset the American president through his perceived lack of engagement and reluctance to strike a deal.

The moral and ethical questions are obvious. How do we broker peace without ceding territory and rewarding violence? How can we trust a violent leader and protect innocent civilians from future attack?

Traditionally, a 'just war' argument maintained that it was reasonable to engage in war if the actions of the enemy were clearly morally wrong and a nation had to defend itself in order to protect the innocent. It also argued that all violence should be proportionate and discriminatory between combatants and non-combatants. Unfortunately, in recent years we have seen that this hasn't been the case, with a lot of violence being hugely disproportionate as swathes of the civilian population were caught up in the conflict. This means that much of the 'just war' theory has fallen short as the Ukrainian people were subjected not just to war but to terrorism.

The Christian and most right-minded people will see this as being evidence of the fact that we live in a fallen and imperfect world. It is therefore the duty of national leaders to do all that they can to restrain evil and promote security and peace. This will require us all and especially our leaders to pray and work towards a *just end* and sue for peace, encouraging repentance and a change of attitude, heart and mind. These are things that we cannot really do by ourselves but only with the help of God. Donald Trump may long for peace and call himself a deal maker, but the real peacemaker is the Lord Jesus Christ, the 'prince of peace', who calls us all to repent and seek forgiveness in his name. Let's pray for all our world leaders, that they might successfully walk the tightrope towards peace and not fall into the danger of the abyss.
