

Ghostly Airfields and Superstitions: Old airfields and ghost stories go hand-in-hand. RECIPE OF THE MONTH: CAJUN CREAMY CHICKEN AND PASTA: Serves 2

1 large saucepan; 1 medium frying pan; and 1 basin

4 oz Penne pasta; 1 tablespoon olive oil; 2 boneless skinless chicken breasts diced; 2 rounded teaspoons Cajun seasoning divided; 1 oz butter; 1 clove garlic finely chopped; 1 heaped dessertspoon plain flour; 8 fluid ounces double cream; 1 oz grated Parmesan; salt and pepper to taste; 1 thinly diced tomato; and 1 tablespoon fresh chopped parsley or 1 tablespoon frozen parsley.

Bring a large saucepan of water to the boil with ¼ teaspoon salt. Add the Penne pasta and cook according to packet instructions approximately 12 minutes. Once cooked, reserve two tablespoons of the water, drain the remainder, cover and set aside. Pour the olive oil into the frying pan over medium heat. In the basin add 1 teaspoon Cajun seasoning to the chicken pieces and toss to cover. Then place the chicken in the frying pan and fry for about 5 minutes. Lower the heat then add the butter and garlic and sauté for about 1 minute. Now sprinkle over the flour mixing well to combine then add the double cream and the reserved pasta water, stirring continuously for about a minute until the sauce thickens. Add the Parmesan cheese and let it melt completely then add the remainder of the Cajun seasoning. Add the salt and pepper as necessary. Pour the pasta into the chicken mixture with the diced tomato and parsley. If the sauce is too thick add extra cream or water. Adjust the Cajun spices if not seasoned enough. Serve with a green vegetable or salad and flat bread.

Balls, Bedrooms and Banquets: On the Thursday 4th September, members gathered at Holme Hale Village Hall to welcome local celebrity author and speaker, John Vigar. His talk, 'Balls, Bedrooms and Banquets' explored the history of the country house. John's slide show gave various examples of the increasingly elaborate layout and construction of grand country houses where a display of wealth and entertaining of guests, including royalty and their entourage, became an essential requirement. As ever, John sprinkled his talk with amusing facts: for example that carpets were originally considered too precious to be placed on the floor and therefore laid as a form of table cloth for important guests. The Naked Chef? Perhaps the most arresting image came from the fact that Chefs originally cooked unclothed (presumably because of the heat rather than exhibitionism) before moving to wearing 'whites' to show how clean they were for food preparation! The meeting also included displays for new interest groups starting up, including a second Creative Writing group, Craft Card making and a new Whats App group to arrange informal outings. Minutes of South Pickenham Parish Council – Wednesday, 10th September at 6pm at the Hub. Present: Cllrs J Blackburne (Chair), S Bloomfield, C & S Chalkley. In attendance: M Cousins (Clerk). Apologies received from NCC/BDCCIIr Eagle.

1. Minutes of meeting held on 16 July 2025 – The Minutes were approved and signed. There were no Matters Arising that were not covered on the Agenda. 2. Venue – The Clerk had checked with NPTS and it is in order for the Council to continue to meet at the Hub, providing that the Bar is not open whilst the meeting is taking place. 3. Vacancy on Council - This had been taken forward with the village residents, but there was not currently anyone willing to join the Council. The Clerk would make further enquiries and report back to the next meeting. 4. Update on PC Website Redevelopment -The Chairman had raised his concerns about the webpage and email. He advised that the new gov.uk webpage and email were now registered and hopefully would be active soon, at which time details would be published in the Pickenham Newsletter. Chairman said that he would also put an item in the Newsletter about the issues. The Clerk would also continue to make enquiries. 5. Street Lighting Maintenance (Cozens) -The Clerk had arranged for this to be paid by Direct Debit but this would not be implemented for several months. In the meantime, the Council will continue to pay by cheque. 6. Update on npower – The Clerk advised that the Street Lighting invoices for the months February to July 2025 had been received on 29 August. 7. Correspondence -a) Norfolk Recycling Centres - NCC are asking for views on these; b) Norfolk Constabulary-Operation Radium - Request for support with Trigger Plan. 8. Approval of Accounts, Cheques issued-Cheque for £54.00 signed for Cozens Ltd; Cheque for £50.00 signed for Mrs R Joachim; Cheque for £125.00 signed for the Clerk's time/expenses.

Main points from the Draft Minutes of North Pickenham Parish Council Meeting - September 2nd, 2025. Co-Option: There were three co-option applications. Only two were considered as one applicant did not attend the meeting. Chairman T. Ryan called for a vote on the first applicant. 1 AGAINST/3 ABSTAIN motion failed. Chairman T Ryan called for a vote on the second applicant. 3 FOR/1 ABSTAIN. Motion carried. Cllr. D Harper signed his Declaration of Office and joined the meeting. Clerk to notify Breckland. Reports: DC Fabian Eagle informed the Council that final submissions are being completed for Local Government Reorganization. He has pushed the booking North Pickenham Road passing by the Red Barn to be lifted up and properly tarmacked. He continues to take part in Solar Farm and Market Town discussions. Chairman T Ryan: Drainage issues in the village are being monitored. There has been an increase in dog fouling incidents in the village. Clerk to liaise with the Breckland Dog Warden to see if they can help. Policies: Safeguarding and CCTV Policy. These policies were reviewed and proposed as accepted. All passed unanimously. Payments: E-ON Pavilion Electricity July, £23.20; TTSR Grass Cutting (Playing Field + Verges), £950.48; Nordwell Fire Extinguisher Check, £71.82; Clerk's wages July (361.66) WFH Allowance (13.50), £375.16; HMRC Tax, £2.42; Backdated pay agreement, £45.76; TUFTS (General Maintenance), £70.68; E-ON Pavilion Electricity August, £33.78; Cozens Street Light Maintenance (Aug/Sep/Oct), £30.00; Clerk Expenses (DBS Check), £21.50; and Clerk's Wages August (371.73) WFH Allowance (13.50), £385.23. Payments were proposed as accepted by Cllr. M Cousins. Seconded by Vice Chairman R Parsonson and approved unanimously. Clerk's Report: The Men's Shed in Necton have said to request quotes for new planters in Spring. The Monitoring Officer finalised their report on concerns raised regarding other interests and voting procedure. Their findings were that voting procedure was not compromised. Projects such as the gravel under the slide, fixing the air walker, and the car park are ongoing, pending quotes, and grant application success. Village Maintenance: Many thanks to Vice Chair R Parsonson for fixing the broken bench on the playing field and the drain pipe on the bus stop. Many thanks to Cllrs. T Goodwin and D Barrington for fixing the zip line. The Parish Council will continue to monitor the zip line. The old bin on the village green next to the village sign has been removed. Clerk to obtain quotes to remove the concrete base and lay a new one for the new bin. The Clerk will be requesting permission from Highways to plant the cherry tree and install the plaque on Houghton Lane near the lay-by. PHC: The Chairman to the Pickenhams' Heritage Collection informed the Parish Council that they will not be pursuing a lease of the Pavilion from the Parish Council at this time. They have many issues they need to resolve before they can apply for Charity Status. This will be tabled for now. Patriotism or prejudice: The conundrum of British flag flying

Many of us will be aware that in recent months there has been a spate of British flag flying, with both Union and St George's Cross Flags being displayed from lampposts, bridges and other prominent locations across the country. For many this has been a source of patriotic delight and pleasure, while for others it has been a foreboding sign of division and 'far-right' intimidation. The truth is as always, more nuanced than this binary description might suggest, for patriotism is not (and nor should it ever be) the sole preserve of the 'far right' as many people across the ages and political spectrum have proudly stood under these flags at many a sporting occasion or days of national significance -and indeed a few have fought for them. Equally, many people of immigrant heritage have proudly adopted the Union flag as their own. Some have suggested that this bout of patriotic flag flying should be seen as a protest to the high levels of illegal migration that we see (which has ballooned since 2020, with last year's figure of 44,000 illegal migrants exceeding the total number of migrants who arrived each year in the 1990s) which inevitably changes communities and puts a strain upon limited resources, especially if there hasn't been enough investment. It's also an attempt to mark out and preserve traditional British culture and values which many seem to think might otherwise be lost. This means that traditional Christian values have inevitably been brought into the conversation and used as 'markers' by those who wish to see less immigration, even if they rarely come to church themselves.

So what can the Bible and a proper Christian understanding teach us in such circumstances? Firstly, there is nothing wrong with patriotism and flag waving, if we use it to unite and inspire communities, bringing them together with a common sense of pride and belonging. But we should never forget that God sent his son into the world, to be the 'Saviour of the world' (1 John 4.14) precisely because he loves the world. If we therefore use our flags to intimidate and cause division, and not act in a loving or compassionate way to those who are in a very real and genuine need, then not only have we turned our patriotism into an idol, (loving our country more than we do God himself) but we have also devalued our flag and the Christian principles upon which it is based.

However, there is no doubt that illegal immigration in such large numbers is a real problem, but we must respond to it in a positive and constructive way, asking ourselves whether cutting the foreign aid budget which might support people in the development of their own countries is actually the wisest thing to do. Likewise attracting employees from abroad, when they are so desperately needed at home might not in a global sense be the best example of 'loving our neighbour as ourselves' (Matthew 22.39), however advantageous it might be to us. The trouble is that it is so easy for our patriotism to turn into prejudice, and we should be constantly vigilant that we don't allow this to happen, choosing instead to prayerfully respond with compassion and kindness. These are the qualities which should feed our patriotism and make our nation proud.
