

Iris Saxon's Super Recipes

CHICKEN TEX-MEX CASSEROLE: Serves 4 plus

1 large saucepan and 1 large casserole dish

Bake: 350F, 160 fan, 180 oven, gas 4 for 25 minutes or air fryer 160 for 15 minutes

1 large onion diced; 3 oz mushrooms sliced; 2 tablespoons olive oil; 1 lb shredded cooked chicken; 1 tin cream of chicken soup; 1 tin cream of mushroom soup; 4 oz finely diced green chillies; 1 large tin chopped tomatoes well drained; 1 teaspoon chilli powder; ½ teaspoon salt; ½ teaspoon pepper; ½ teaspoon garlic granules or 1 clove crushed and finely chopped; 12 tortillas x 6 inches; and 4 oz grated strong cheddar cheese divided into 2 oz portions.

Place the saucepan over medium heat and add the oil and onion plus the fresh garlic clove if using and the sliced mushrooms. Fry until lightly browned then add the soups, chillies, tomatoes, all seasoning and chicken. Cook until bubbling stirring frequently. Lightly grease your casserole dish. Tear 6 of the tortillas into small pieces and cover the base of your casserole dish. Top with half of the chicken mixture and sprinkle with 2 oz of cheddar cheese. Now tear the remaining 6 tortillas and cover the cheese. Add the remainder of the chicken mixture then sprinkle with the last 2 oz cheese. Bake until bubbling and lightly browned around the edges. Serve with rice and a green vegetable.

LEFTOVER HAM BAKED WITH CHEESE AND PASTA: Serves 4

Bake: 350F, 180C, 160 fan, gas 4 for 15-20 minutes – air fryer 180 for 10 minutes 1 small saucepan for white sauce; 1 casserole dish; and 1 medium saucepan for pasta

250g pasta of your choice (Fuselli is good). 250g cubed leftover ham. 2 packets white sauce mix making a pint of sauce. 180g grated strong cheddar cheese divided into 2 equal portions. 2 tablespoons fresh sage finely chopped. ½ teaspoon garlic granules. ½ teaspoon salt to taste as the ham may be quite salty. 1 teaspoon black pepper. 120g fresh breadcrumbs or panko breadcrumbs.

Preheat oven. Cook pasta in boiling water for 12 minutes, drain, cover and set aside. Make the sauce according to the packets, combining the 2. Stir in the pasta, ham, sage, garlic, salt, pepper and half of the cheese. Pour into the lightly greased casserole dish. Mix the breadcrumbs with the remaining 90g of cheese and sprinkle over the top. Bake in the oven then once cooked let it rest for 5 minutes before serving. NOTE: You can substitute the ham for leftover turkey and add some peas, sweet corn and finely diced shallot. Serve with garlic bread, peas, sweet corn or whatever vegetable you fancy.

CHICKEN IN A PARMESAN, WINE AND MUSHROOM SAUCE: Serves 4

1 basin; 1 large frying pan; and 1 jug.

1 lb boneless, skinless chicken breasts diced. 2 oz plain flour. 1 teaspoon Season All. 1 teaspoon paprika. 1 oz butter. 3 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil. 4 oz sliced mushrooms. 2 garlic cloves crushed and finely chopped. 1 large shallot finely diced. 8 fluid oz dry white wine. 4 fluid oz chicken broth made with ½ chicken stock cube. 1 teaspoon dried thyme. 2 oz grated Parmesan. 4 fluid oz double cream. ¼ teaspoon salt. ½ teaspoon pepper.

Make up the chicken broth with boiling water. In the basin combine your flour, Season All, paprika, salt and pepper and mix well together then add the diced chicken coating all the pieces well. Put the frying pan on medium heat with the butter and 2 tablespoons oil. Add the floured chicken and fry for 5 minutes until lightly golden then remove. Add the remaining 1 tablespoon oil plus the shallot, mushrooms and garlic and sauté until beginning to brown then add the wine, broth and thyme. Place the chicken back into the pan, bring to the boil then reduce the heat to a simmer, cover and cook for 12-15 minutes. Remove the chicken from the pan again and add the cheese and cream. Cook, stirring constantly, until the cheese has melted and the liquid has thickened and reduced by half. Add the chicken back to the pan to reheat just for 2-3 minutes. Adjust the seasoning if necessary. Serve with either pasta, garlic bread or mashed potatoes and a green vegetable.

TRANSPORT FOR ALL YOUR NEEDS


Our Community Car Scheme provides transport for shorter or longer distances e.g. Kings Lynn/Norwich/Addenbrookes mainly for medical appointments.

Our friendly volunteer drivers, all DBS checked, help us to offer this scheme which is a chargeable service to cover the cost of the mileage for the volunteer.

The following charges apply: 45p per mile from drivers' home to pick up; 50p per mile from your house to the destination; the price includes a given waiting time and an admin fee for booking; Should your appointment exceed the given waiting time, this will be charged at £3 per half an hour.

We will always try and find the closest driver available to help make the transport as cheap as possible for you. It also helps if the booking is made with plenty of notice.
